
### **Delivery**

Blended delivery including; one to one support with a competent tutor, along with a remote or face to face learning environment. We have a recently developed ESkills platform that all learners can use as a resource when completing their units to develop their competencies

#### **End Point Assessment**

At the end of the apprenticeship program, learners must complete their End Point Assessment (EPA). This is completed by an external EPA provider (TQUK).
